

Rich in the Rare

EXHIBIT BACKGROUND

“Rich in the Rare” showcases some of North Carolina’s rare plant and animal species. An introductory panel defines terms that relate to the health of a particular population, including “extinct,” “endangered,” and “threatened.” Five subsequent panels highlight some of the state’s most unique habitats, from the mountains to the coast, as well as 3-5 species endemic to each and inset sections on what people can do to help protect the wildlife and environments.



EDUCATIONAL COMPONENTS

Suggested children’s activities include monitoring a loggerhead turtle nest, coloring pages and a hidden touch box to guess what’s inside.

AT-A-GLANCE SPECS

SIZE 6 retractable free-standing banners (34” wide x 80” tall) with addition of props and educational interactives to teach visitors about rare and endangered species in North Carolina.
